



NEW & TOUCH UP EYELINER

Healing Schedule & Post Procedural Care Instructions

Congratulations on the final step of your re-construction journey. We are excited to provide you with the finishing touch to help you look and feel complete.

DAY

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- 1 Swollen, like you've been crying, with a heavier eye makeup look.
- 2 Swollen, usually for only a few hours after waking up, with the heavier eye makeup look continuing.
- 3 Swelling decreases with a tight feeling. The pigment begins to lift away from the skin.
- 4 There is a "pinching" feeling. Some itching is normal as the skin begins to flake. **DO NOT PICK AT IT.**
- 5 Blinking movements of the eye usually removes all pigment by this day. Color is somewhat grayish and will take a few more days to clarify to full color.

SWELLING

Expect light to moderate swelling and redness for 1 - 2 days following the procedure. Tea bags or ice packs should be applied the first day to reduce swelling - 10 minutes on and 10 minutes off. The eye area may be puffy for the first few mornings. Beginning on the second day, apply an ice or tea bag on the eyes in the morning. The wider the liner, the more swelling is to be expected. Tails may cause redness on outer corner of eyes.

MOISTURE

Wash eyes the first morning following the procedure with antimicrobial soap and water. Rinse well and pat, very lightly, dry. Keep the eyeliner only slightly moist with A&D ointment 2-3 times a day for 5 to 7 days. Nothing other than recommended ointments (A&D, Aquaphor, Vaseline or Lacri-Lube) should be used.

AVOID

Contact lenses the day of procedure. (Contacts may be used when your eyes return to their pre-procedure condition) Please bring your glasses!

Chlorine pools, Retin A or Glycolic acids totally. No Jacuzzis or saunas, terry towels on pigmented area. No hot, steamy, long showers. Shower with your back to the water to avoid water, shampoo and conditioner from getting into pigmented area. Apply a thin coat of Tattoo Goo or A&D over pigment before showering.

The use of an eyelash curler or mascara for seven days. Purchase a new tube of mascara as bacteria can grow in your old tube.

Avoid using too much ointment. If you can see it, you have too much on. Simply apply the thinnest coat with a Q-tip and avoid getting it into your eye as this can invite an infection. Only re-apply when the eyelid area begins to feel tight. Clean the excess buildup of ointments from lash line every night with a warm water soaked Q-tip.

COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS -

Don't be alarmed by fading after the first application. The final color cannot be judged until 2 weeks after the Perfecting Session is completed. Don't be alarmed by color coming off on the Q-tip when applying ointment as this is normal.

Although your eyelid may have a slight pink or redness above the eyeliner immediately following the procedure, if you see signs of an infection, please contact your medical provider.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW POST-PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS MAY RESULT IN LOSS OR DISCOLORATION OF PIGMENT. THE KNOWN POSSIBLE COMPLICATIONS FROM MICROPIGMENTATION ARE: REDNESS; SWELLING; PUFFINESS; BRUISING; DRY PATCHES; TENDERNESS. IT IS NORMAL TO LOSE APPROXIMATELY 1/3 OF THE COLOR DURING THE HEALING PROCESS. AFTER INITIAL PROCEDURE, THE COLOR MAY BE A SHADE TOO DARK; IN SIX DAYS IT WILL APPEAR TOO LIGHT. AFTER 10 DAYS, THE COLOR WILL SHOW MORE. IT WILL APPEAR SOFTER WHEN COMPLETELY HEALED BECAUSE THE COLOR WILL COME FROM THE DERMAL LAYER OF THE SKIN TO THE EPIDERMAL LAYER OF THE SKIN.
